書院的學生服務和活動

此外·書院各有學生輔導處·除了負責書院獎學金和經濟援助及管理學生宿舍事宜 外·還為學生提供個別的輔導服務·以及協助書院學生會、宿生會、走讀生舍堂和其 他書院學生團體舉辦各種文娛活動。

各書院為學生提供一系列的活動。這些非形式教育機會與正規課程相輔相成,旨在培養學生的人際關係技巧、文化品味、自信心和責任感。書院除舉辦海外交換和外訪計劃外,還有各類講座和研討會,語文、資訊科技和領袖訓練班,文化和健體活動,以及社會服務計劃。

學生會

大學現有八個本科生學生會·包括中大學生會及九所書院(崇基、新亞、聯合、逸夫、 晨興、善衡、敬文、伍宜孫及和聲)的學生會·他們均有組織不同的文娛活動。

The Office of Student Affairs is committed to facilitating the all-round development and personal growth of students of the University. To achieve its goals, There are different sections in the Office of Student Affairs, each providing professional services in their respective areas to our students, which aim at meeting their varying needs as they progress along their university years:

Student Activities and Amenities

- Coordinate orientation arrangements and activities, and assist in organizing local new student orientation camps.
- 2. Support student associations and provide guidance to their activities.
- 3. Administer student activity funds.
- Organize University-wide and intervarsity activities including leadership development programmes.
- 5. Manage "Student Development Portfolio" which serves as a roadmap for students on the experiential learning opportunities
- 6. Manage student amenities located in Benjamin Franklin Centre, John Fulton Centre, Pommerenke Student Centre as well as the University Swimming Pool.
- 7. Oversee the day-to-day operation of the commercial services units located at the

- staff-student centres, including the supermarket, convenient store, and barber shop.
- 8. Administer the online booking system to provide loan service of facilities and equipment to students and departments.
- 9. Manage the International House (on campus student residence).

Student Services at Colleges

Guidance on personal and interpersonal problems is also provided by the Dean of Students' Offices at the Colleges. These offices administer College scholarship and bursary awards and also play a vital role in the enrichment of College life. In close cooperation and collaboration with the College student unions and their affiliated societies, the Dean of Students' Offices also oversee the execution of College-wide student activities and programmes.

A wide range of student activities and programmes are offered by the Colleges. These non-formal learning opportunities complement the formal curricula, nurture students' interpersonal skills and cultural sensitivity, and build up their confidence and sense of social responsibility. Besides overseas exchange and student visitor programmes, there are talks and seminars, community service programmes, and training in languages, IT, leadership, culture and physical fitness.

Student Unions

At present, there are ten undergraduate student unions in the University, one for the University as a whole, and one each for Chung Chi College, New Asia College, United College, Shaw College, Morningside College, S.H. Ho College, C.W. Chu College, Wu Yee Sun College and Lee Woo Sing College. All year round, a wide range of activities, including academic, athletic, cultural as well as social functions are organized by the student unions.

師生諮詢委員會

Staff-Student Consultative Committee

由 2007-08 學年起·教育學院的師生諮詢委員會由各課程分別進行諮詢工作。諮詢委員會成員包括任教各相關課程的教師、主要行政人員及該課程學生代表·委員會透過師生間的意見交流·對學院之課程、教學、評核、制度、措施、設施等方面提出問題及意見·然後將有關意見或決議提交教育學院院務會或各校內外部門及人士回應。學生代表之主要工作為徵集該課程同學意見·於師生諮詢委員會會議上提出討論·或直接向有關行政人員或導師反映。

師生諮詢委員會之學生代表組成結構如下:

(1) 高級學位課程

每年召開一次諮詢會議,學生代表包括:

■ 每項課程一名代表

(2) 學位教師教育文憑課程

每年召開兩次諮詢會議,學生代表包括:

「學位教師教育文憑(中學)課程」、「學位教師教育文憑(小學)課程」及「學位教師教育文憑(幼兒教育)課程」

全日制課程:每一「分科課程與教學法」科目之班代表 兼讀制課程:每一「分科課程與教學法」科目之班代表

教育學會:二名代表

(3) 學士學位課程

由各課程負責人決定會議召開形式及學生代表之組成結構。

學生觀察員的職責

學生觀察員是由同學於師生諮詢委員會會議上互選產生,並於教育學院院務會、教育高級課程委員會、教育專業課程委員會或教育本科課程委員會各會議中列席。現時學生觀察員約須出席四次委員會會議。學生觀察員的設立是為了收集同學有關課程及學習上的意見、讓學生多了解學院及增加院方會議透明度。而學生觀察員亦可將學院資訊帶給同學,並在會議中提出問題或向學院院方反映意見。

Starting from 2007-08, the Staff-Student Consultative Committee is a programme-based advisory body. Members include all teachers, major administrative staff and student representatives of the programme. The Committee meets with staff and current students to have formal discussion on matters pertaining to the curricula, teaching, evaluation, institutions, measures and facilities in the Faculty's domain. It then channels all opinions and resolutions to the Faculty Board of Education and/or other concerned parties for response. The student representatives will collect students' opinions and present them to the Committee or directly to relevant administrative/teaching staff. The composition of student representatives for the Staff-Student Consultative Committee is as follows:

(1) Higher Degree Programmes

The Committee meets annually, the student representatives include:

• 1 from each programme

(2) Postgraduate Diploma in Education (PGDE) Programmes

The Committee meets twice a year, the student representatives include:

• PGDE (Secondary) Programme,

PGDE (Primary) Programme and

PGDE (Early Childhood Education) Programme

1 from each full-time SCT

1 from each part-time SCT

2 from the Education Society

(3) Undergraduate Programmes

Each programme decides its format of meeting and composition of student representatives.

Duties of Student Observers

Student observers are elected by current students at the Staff-student Consultative Committee Meeting to attend meetings of the Faculty Board of Education, Board of Postgraduate Studies in Education, Board of Professional Programmes in Education or Board of Undergraduate Studies in Education. They have to attend approximately four meetings of the respective Boards. The purposes of having student observers are to collect student opinions on curriculum and on matters related to student learning, to let students better understand the Faculty as well as to increase transparency of the Board's meetings. Student observers are responsible for passing updated information of the Faculty to their classmates and reflecting any feedbacks to the Faculty at the meeting.

學生組織

Student Organizations

本院屬下有多個學生自治組織·由不同課程學員籌組而成·其中主要組織包括教育學會、語文教育學會、數學及數學教育學會、通識教育學會、健康與體育運動科學學會及運動科學與健康教育學會·成員分別為全日制學位教師教育文憑課程同學及全日制教育學士學位課程同學。各會社的幹事均由學生自由組閣選舉產生。學會每年舉辦多項活動·包括文娛、康樂、體育及學術各方面·以充實同學之課餘生活。

The Faculty has several student organizations maintained by different academic programmes. The major ones include the Education Society, the Language Education Society, the Mathematics and Mathematics Education Society, the Liberal Studies Society, the Physical Education, Exercise Science & Health Society and the Exercise Science & Health Education Society. The first has a membership open to all Full-time Postgraduate Diploma in Education students and the rest to respective full-time Bachelor of Education students. Students are free to form cabinets and elect committee members among themselves. These societies organize a wide range of cultural, recreational, sports and academic activities to enrich students' extra-curricular lives.
