

- JK: You're welcome.







1. Needs analysis (Students)

> Needs: special education needs and learning styles



Fleming's VARK Learning Styles

1. Needs analysis (Students)

> Lacks: motivation, self-confidence and skills

- Macro skills: self-learning strategies
- Micro skills: looking up new words in dictionaries, decoding etc.

1. Needs analysis (Students)

> Wants: fun and interaction

- Interaction with peers
- Interaction with the language inputs (purpose for learning)

2. Co-planning: done vs done better

- > CARS of current teaching materials
- · Change: teaching flow / emphasis for streamed classes
- · Adapt: language complexity
- · Replace: using more suitable materials
- · Select: picking appropriate teaching points

2. Co-planning: done vs done better

> PIE

- · Planning: what to teach vs what & how to teach
- Implementation: expect problems and prepare solutions in advance
- Evaluation: reviewing students sparkling and difficult moments → adjustment

2. Co-planning and Teaching

- > Knowledge, Skills and Attitudes
- *Knowledge: thorough (high-order) coverage and effective delivery
- Skills: allowing space for practising and applying certain skills
- · Attitudes: general and school-based
 - > embed, identify, apply and reflect
- · More to be done: Skills and Attitudes with learning tasks

3. SCT: room for enhancement

- > SMART(ER) learning objectives: focused and extended
- > Questioning: HOT (quantity, quality, follow-up)
- Feedback: positive and constructive spoken and written comments (PERMA)
- > Participation: quality individual, pair and group tasks (with tools)
- > Interaction: group activities with learning inputs and outputs
- > Assessment as/ for learning: reviewing every learning task

4. PERMA in practice


